Dear High Storrs Families,

National Apprenticeship Week 2024 is 5 – 11 February. Across the week there will be a number of activities shared with students to highlight and promote apprenticeships as a route for career progression: apprenticeships lead to qualifications that are equivalent to GCSEs, A Levels and degrees. This week's Group Chat, delivered by form tutors, introduces National Apprenticeship Week and provides key information about apprenticeships as both a Post 16 and a Post 18 option for students.

 Vacancies – UCAS is one source to view national and local apprenticeship vacancies, which can help you to get a sense of what roles are out there: https://careerfinder.ucas.com/jobs/apprenticeship/sheffield/ We would recommend checking this website regularly (or setting up an email alert) as there will be more vacancies as the academic year progresses.

At the time of writing this letter, there are 2258 apprenticeship vacancies nationally, with 28 adverts in South Yorkshire and 19 in Sheffield. Although apprenticeship recruitment works in the same way as job recruitment (i.e. advertised when a role is needed), there is a spike in roles advertised towards the end of the academic year when students are completing their GCSEs, A Levels or equivalents.
