## Subject: Important Information Regarding A Level/BTEC Exams, Attendance and Study Leave

Dear Y13 Students,

As you embark on the final few weeks of your Sixth Form journey, it is very important to ensure that you are well-prepared and focused for your final exams. With this in mind, I am writing to provide you with some important details regarding study leave and the upcoming exam period. There is a lot of information in this email, so please read it all through carefully – and do come and ask if you have any questions.

During your final few weeks of A Level and BTEC study, it is essential to strike a balance between your independent revision and utilising the expertise of your subject teachers. While independent study allows you to focus on areas where you need improvement and to develop your own exam skills, your subject experts are invaluable resources. Please continue to seek their guidance and review challenging concepts with them.

Your final subject lessons will conclude on Friday, 17th May in the morning. Following this, we will gather for a final celebration assembly at 1.15pm on the same day in the Sports Hall.

From Monday 20<sup>th</sup> May, you will formally be on study leave. This means you can revise at home, although you are welcome to revise in the Sixth Form areas during the school day. <u>During your period of study leave and the exam period you must use your ID badge to sign in and out at visitor reception</u>. Your teachers will also be available in your timetabled lesson times until your final exams in their subjects. They will not plan formal lessons from Monday 20<sup>th</sup> May, but they will be in their classrooms ready to support you: you could attend to review a complicated topic, you could take an essay for them to mark etc.

If you have an exam between Monday 13<sup>th</sup> and Friday 17<sup>th</sup> May, you are entitled to a ½ day of study leave immediately prior to the exam (i.e. for an afternoon exam, the morning of the exam and for morning exam the afternoon of the day before). Please complete a short Study Leave Request Form for each absence so that we can mark your attendance accurately. To support the increasing need for final independent revision, your Tutorial and Student support lessons will end after Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> May. This means you will have additional time to dedicate to independent preparation for your exams. However, I want to stress the importance of attendance until the final dates mentioned above – any absences will not be authorised.

During the Tutorial hour P2 on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup>, Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> May subject-specific support will be provided by Y13 tutors in the following subject areas: Classics (L02), English Language (L08), French (L24a), Geography (U18), History (U15), Mathematics (L16), Philosophy & Ethics (U11). Staff will be available in these



classrooms if you would like to talk through a concept, show them an essay/ part of an exam paper during that time etc (but they are not planning revision sessions).

Remember, this is a time of very focused final exam preparation, but it is equally important to maintain a healthy balance in your life. Make sure that you have a clear revision plan that supports you to take breaks, get enough rest, and engage in activities that help alleviate stress. It is natural to feel stressed leading up to your final exams, but if you are worried about anything, please see Miss Thew, Mr Kelly or myself.
